### Peer Tutoring at Winsor

Peer Tutoring at Winsor is largely student driven. The coordinator of academic support oversees the peer tutoring program, providing guidance and resources, as well as coordinating schedules. Peer tutors include students in Class VII and VIII who volunteer to tutor students in a variety of subjects. Peer tutors meet with their tutees during mutually free periods, at least once a week but no more than twice a week. The number of meetings varies depending on the student's goals and progress. In addition to 1-1 help, peer tutors also offer drop in sessions for biology and chemistry.
